Dear Premier Ford, Dear Ms Horwath, Dear Mr. Del Duca, Dear Mr. Schreiner,

In a 2021 study, the Office of the Commissioner of Official Languages found that 81% of Ontarians agree that more needs to be done so that young people can become bilingual.*

French Second Language (FSL) programs are supported in Ontario elementary and secondary schools with policy, curriculum and funding from the Government of Ontario. Through the Official Languages in Education Protocol and Agreement with the Government of Canada, the Government of Ontario commits to strengthening FSL programs and to ensuring that the opportunity is there for all students to become bilingual in French and English, our Official Languages.

And yet, Ontario students do not have universal access to quality French immersion programs. Ontario enrolment rates in French immersion as a percentage of total student enrolment continue to lag behind those of Manitoba, Nova Scotia, Newfoundland & Labrador, Prince Edward Island, the Northwest Territories and the Yukon. As a network of parents/caregivers and volunteers across Ontario and Canada, we promote opportunities for youth to learn and use French. 4. If elected, how will you and your party ensure that we have an adequate supply of qualified French teachers across Ontario?
5. What will you and your party do to make Ontario a leader in graduating English/French bilinguals from our French Second Language programs?
