

W. R. McGILLIVRAY AWARD GUIDELINES for the SUBMISSION of APPLICATIONS

Canadian Parents for French (Ontario) established the **W.R. McGillivray Award** in 1986 as a special tribute to the memory of Russ McGillivray and the outstanding contribution he made to the development of bilingual education. Russ McGillivray was a Superintendent of Schools and a Superintendent of Program with the Carleton Board of Education. His special focus was in the area of bilingual education. He played a leading role in the initial development and growth of early and late immersion programs in the Carleton Board. As well, he advised numerous boards of education on French Second Language (FSL) programs and lectured on the topic throughout North America. He is the author of several articles on many aspects of FSL education and was a special friend to CPF Ontario.

CPF Ontario is seeking award nominations for a person currently in a position of responsibility in education who has shown initiative, leadership and commitment in promoting the development of FSL learning in Ontario. For example, a nominee may be, and is not limited to, a school board administrator, coordinator, school principal, vice principal, department head or teacher.

Nominations will stand for consideration for two consecutive years. Candidates can only receive the award one time. CPF Ontario Board members are not eligible to nominate nor receive the award.
